Situated on the banks of the Luwego and Lukula rivers in Southern Tanzania in the largest game reserve in Africa, amongst the forests and savannas that run free across this wild and rugged landscape, is a pristine private photographic reserve of breathtaking beauty. Here two daring young professional guides and conservationists, Anton Turner and Ryan Wienand, have set out like explorers and adventurers not only to preserve a vast unspoilt landscape but to expand it for conservation so that its habitats and wildlife can thrive for generations. This is 'The Selous Project'.

The Project offers guests an exciting opportunity to join Anton and Ryan in exploring the primeval 350,000-acre Lukula Concession in the Selous in a totally unique way. Foremost, this vast concession is exclusive to you and your friends with complete freedom and flexibility. There are no fixed schedules – an idea shared at the dinner table or an inspiration at the dawn of the day could provide the spark for your next adventure. If you wished, you could immerse yourselves in the adventure and walk for 3 days while fly-camping along the Lukula or Luwego rivers, or for a more leisurely outing follow a herd of buffalos for the day. Whatever your activity, you will come face to face with Africa's purest wilderness in an unimaginably thrilling style in the company of some of the finest guides and trackers in Africa.





LEMALA LUXURY CAMPS

Two superb seasonal camps in fine locations bringing the wildlife and migration closer to the guests.

Lemala Ngorongoro and its luxurious heated tents are perched on the rim of the crater inside a gorgeous acacia woodland, seconds away from the quiet Lemala entry route. By staying at Lemala Ngorongoro, guests avoid queues and traffic jams to enter the crater besides enjoying a secluded, intimate stay in the delightful natural surroundings of the conservation area.

Lemala Ndotu is set up in a beautiful site with abundant mature acacia trees overlooking a marsh near Lake Ndotu. The permanent waters of the marsh are a draw for grazers, browsers and predators year round and the success of the Ndotu location is defined by the regular cheetah, leopard, lion, elephant and buffalo sightings from 1st December until 15th April, when the camp closes to move to northern Serengeti near the Mara River. Lemala Ndotu is also the ideal place to watch the migration, calving and rutting between January and April.

Lemala Mara North Serengeti has a brilliant central location in Northern Serengeti with easy access to four great migration areas - Bologonja Plains, Tabora B, Kogatende/Mara River and Lamai triangle. Guests at this luxury seasonal camp, which overlooks a vast elevated expanse of the Serengeti grasslands, can follow the migration from June onwards when the first herds hit the Bologonja and Tabora B plains. As they head northwards through July and August, guests switch to Kogatende, Mara River and Lamai areas and follow the migration right up to 15th November when the camp closes to move south once again. Off-road game drives are permitted in Northern Serengeti and for migration followers wishing to avoid the crowds this presents a huge advantage over the Masai Mara or other areas of the Serengeti.
